Written in the late 1950s, this was one of a series of county turnpike studies by Arthur Cossons (1893-1963), and the only one not published in his lifetime The first turnpike road to reach Leicestershire crossed the border from the south in 1721. This book provides a comprehensive account of how, over the next 160 years, the roads of the two counties were transformed from barely passable tracks into a well-maintained network. Thus the turnpikes laid the foundation for the revolution in road transport
